## Health Day, January, 2011 Class of 2011 Report

In the chapel at All Childrens Hospital lies an open prayer book. One parent's recent entry: "Pray that you may help me understand the purpose, so I may be brave for him."

**Ileane Altamura '10** knows that need well. What helped her stay brave as her ten year-old-daughter – her "baby" – underwent open heart surgery? Leadership Pinellas.

"Never did I realize in my wildest imagination that I would stay one week in the hospital room that I toured with my Leadership class, and that my daughter would be hooked up to all of those wires that you will see," Ileane shared with this year's class.

But just a few months earlier, she had watched open heart surgery as part of Leadership Pinellas Health Day. "I remembered how relaxed the surgeons were in watching them perform an open heart surgery," she says. That insight strengthened Ileane and her daughter, who two months after surgery, was playing soccer.

The new, ten-floor All Children's Hospital opened just last year with:

- *A \$4 million Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) with a \$1 million rubber floor to absorb sound.* Two thirds of the children at this hospital are typically in intensive care, twice as many as in most hospitals.
- *A \$50,000 Giraffe Crib* which recreates the sounds, temperature and humidity of a mother's womb to heal babies born prematurely. It also moves up and down on a long neck to accommodate taller caregivers.
- *Multiple Birth Rooms* so mothers of triplets, for example, don't travel down the hall to nurse each one.
- *Thumbprint-activated machines* which automatically disburse the correct dosage once you type the child's name.
- *Three Ronald McDonald Houses* for families of children in long-term intensive care. Some cannot shower in the same room as their child, for example, if the child underwent a bone marrow transplant. Two families are there now from Guatemala; in the past, they have traveled from Haiti, England, and Germany.
- *A decontamination unit at the Emergency Center entrance* which senses an ambulance's approach and immediately pushes chemicals, exhaust and polluted air away from the child's mouth.
- *A pending integration into Johns Hopkins Medicine in Baltimore* which would:
  - Name a Johns Hopkins doctor as interim pediatrician-in-chief for All Children's,
  - Appoint four Johns Hopkins physicians to the All Children's Board, with two from All Children's taking seats on Johns Hopkins' board,
  - Expand pediatric care in Central and South America, drawing international attention to St. Petersburg, and
  - Bring Johns Hopkins' world-class teaching and research to All Childrens. (cont.)

Children suffering life-threatening injuries are rushed next door first, to Bayfront Medical Center, Pinellas County's only trauma center. "It is very unimpressive to look at in terms of layout, but I can assure you amazing things happen here. Amazing!" said Amanda Maxim, Emergency Department Manager.

For example, Bayfront trains combat medics, such as Navy SEALs or Green Berets, for battle on the front lines. Bayfront also runs five, \$5 million helicopters, manned with paramedics, blood and medical equipment, in Sarasota, Tampa, New Port Richey, and Hernando County – areas which lack trauma centers.

"My father was saved at Bayfront. My loved one was saved from cancer at Morton Plant. When I did my ridealong, Bayflite came," remembers Program Day co-coordinator **Amanda Fisher '07**. "I had my appendix out at Morton Plant."

Morton Plant Hospital Director of Operations **Matt Novak '06** led us to the \$1.65 million DaVinci robot, which performs delicate surgeries through small cuts in the human body, while a doctor controls the robot's arms and miniature instruments from a console several feet away. "Since the pelvis is very tiny with lots of nerves, instead of having huge hands in your pelvis, there is not as big a chance for nerve damage with tiny instruments," said Kristen Cahill, patient services. "The robot provides instant tremor control."

At Morgan Heart Hospital, the only hospital to be named among the top 50 heart hospitals in the country (based on patient outcomes) twelve years in a row, we watched a doctor install a stent in a 76-year-old man whose artery was 90% blocked. The man, awake during the procedure, had previously undergone bypass surgery, a pacemaker and hip replacement.

"Patients are getting younger and younger," noted Colleen Rutri, manager of the Cardiac Cath Lab. "We used to see the norm of 60-65. We're getting 40 year olds now. Our food, our stress, we're always on the go. It has a lot to do with how we've changed as a society."

More telling than the tour, perhaps, were the interactions along the way:

"I had a breast cancer scare last year and came here," said **Rebekah Apple '11**. "They were fantastic. There was no waiting for the doctor, they were just very nice."

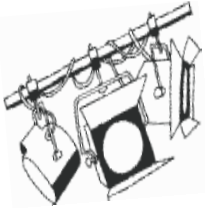
**Bobby Metz '11** recognized a technician from his wife's recent childbirth. "You gave my wife anesthesia," he said, to which the technician joked, "Did it work?"

Sunstar EMS Chief Operating Officer **Mark Postma '08** showed us ambulances now being equipped with solar power, explaining that Sunstar generates \$43 million in annual revenue for Pinellas County. Meanwhile, **Jeannie Shapiro '00** at Clearwater Free Clinic is seeing more middle income families: "Everyone thinks about a free clinic as being a Haight-Ashbury: alcoholics, drug addicts and homeless lying out front. That is not Clearwater Free Clinic. It's a beautiful facility run by doctors and nurses and nonmedical people."

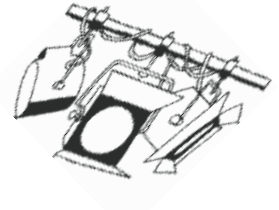

The Class of 2011 fundraiser is expected to raise \$40,000 – as well as awareness and community volunteerism – for the Heart Gallery of Pinellas & Pasco, which connects adoptive families to children who been in foster homes for years.*

*“I can’t tell you how exciting it is for all of us,” said Kristin Brett, Heart Gallery executive director. “The website looks terrific, you have a great venue and have already lined up a great band and restaurant sponsor. You have all the makings of a really fun and successful event.”*

*The Rhythm of the Heart Gala will be held at Earthscapes Garden Room, an outdoor facility in Palm Harbor, with catering by Thirsty Marlin’ and entertainment by the noteworthy band, Buffalo Strange.*

*“I was skeptical of this location at the beginning,” says **Josh Bouchard '11**, “but after walking through twice in the past week, I am incredibly excited about the event! It is going to be a very unique and definitely fun event! The committee was dead on with voting majority on this location.”*

*The Heart Gallery is staging a photo shoot at Earthscapes, featuring a foster child, to use in sponsorship letters, invitations, and advertising. In addition to the Porsche racing and Don Cesar stay, silent auction items include a guided flats trip and fly casting lessons, a suite and food for 20 at a Tampa Yankees game, and a Best of the Arts Across the Bay package. Tom Carey of Carey & Leisure contributed \$500 seed money. Event tickets are now on sale at [eventbrite.com](http://eventbrite.com), under Rhythm of the Heart, and more information can be found at [www.rhythmoftheheart.org](http://www.rhythmoftheheart.org).*

*Of course, Class of 2011 is doing more than fundraising for one signature project. Our mission is to give every month – in multiple ways.*

*The **Volunteerism Committee** has organized service projects at Boys and Girls Club of the Suncoast, Homeless Emergency Project, (HEP), and Habitat for Humanity. This month, at St. Petersburg Free Clinic, class members stuffed event invitations, landscaped, cleaned the parking lot, sorted food, created rice bags for distribution, and painted the office and clinic. Class members have spent 300 hours volunteering as a class and individually so far. Our goal is 1,000 hours.*

*The **Goods Donation Committee** coordinates monthly giving on each program day. For example, on Health Day, the class contributed \$740 in cash and first aid items for the Clearwater Free Clinic. Next month on Arts and Culture Day, we will be donating art supplies to the Dunedin Fine Arts Center.*
