Criminal Justice Day, May 11, 2011

Class of 2011 Report

It's amazing what you hear at the shooting range. Take **Claire Enick '11**, for example, introduced at the initial class retreat as a book club leader, always neatly dressed, sweet, unassuming and relatively quiet. Until, on Criminal Justice Day, she burst off the lane after firing a semi-automatic rifle and gushed, "I love that thing!" Turns out she learned to shoot growing up on a farm in central Florida -- and still goes skeet shooting for fun.

Then there's **Hollie Kier '11**: "What a rush! That was fun! My son starts at the [Police] Academy in two weeks, so I shot a gun for him." And **Jamie Hicks '11**, who upon hearing that the SWAT team often aims below the belt: "Low blow, low blow. But all's fair in love and war!"

Perhaps most fascinating were the stories in the Pinellas County jail where, for example, inmates on maximum security lockdown purposely flooded their cells by plugging the toilet, until the jail instituted an automatic shutoff. Jailors have noticed that each pod appoints a "cell rep," usually the biggest inmate or the one who has served the most time. The cell rep then assigns jobs to fellow inmates, such as dialing and holding the pay phone until his attorney takes the call.

"No one ever fights barefoot, so if you see a bunch of guys pulling on their shoes, you know there's going to be a fight," said Deputy David Spielmeyer, who investigates crimes within the jail. "They read lips, shoot gang signs, and you can't keep up with 'em." He pulled one inmate who had been routinely abused by his cellmates, but the man fell asleep during questioning. In the interrogation room, Spielmeyer said, was the first time the inmate felt safe enough to sleep.

"The easiest to get along with are the murderers," Spielmeyer says. "They know they'll be here for a long time. Sex offenders are very clean and neat. Just like in the public, they try to manipulate people's image of them."

We also saw inmate commerce: styling each other's hair for a price, for example, or selling rights to the best telephone times. Other inmates are paid to sound a warning when deputies approach the pod. Some women apply cigarette ashes to their face as makeup and KoolAid as clothing dye.

The most unruly inmates are carried out of their cell by a team in full combat gear who may gas the cell if the inmate has a weapon, then pin him to the floor and tie belts around his arms and legs. "It's like a suitcase. They pick him up by four handles," Major Dan Simovich, Jr. said. Some inmates purposely soak in soapy water, urine or feces to make themselves slippery. At that point, they may be buckled into a restraining chair and mask: "You hear them all the time: 'I can't breathe, I can't breathe.' Well, they're yelling at you, so you know they're breathing," Scott Kremser of the Sheriff's Office says.

In stark contrast to maximum security lockdown: the so-called "central division," where only one deputy supervises 80 inmates in a common area, with tables and chairs not even bolted to the floor. "It sounds crazy but I can count on one hand the number of major incidents," Sheriff Jim Coats said. Could 80 rioting inmates take the single deputy hostage? Only temporarily, Major Simovich says, until the SWAT team charges. "The calvary's always coming. The good guys are going to win. Someone may die, but we'll get our deputy."

Also among the interesting personalities on Criminal Justice Day: Pinellas County Sheriff's Specialist Anna Cox, who interprets blood spatter at a crime scene: "I pass out at the sight of my own blood. Drop like a sack of potatoes!" But after 11 years, she can spot blood that appears orange in extreme cold or black on tile, as well as invisible evidence such as hair, fiber, paint, soils, accelerants and bodily fluids. "We can't afford to miss the evidence," she says as she lifts fingerprints off duct tape and a laminate floor. "Otherwise your infamous serial killer, James Randall, would still be driving around Fort Harrison, killing prostitutes."

Watching Clearwater Police Department K9 dogs practice their attack was another highlight of the day. These purebred shepherds are imported from Europe and typically cost six to eight thousand dollars each. All are male to avoid time in heat. Sergeant Jim Hall called training with the dog "a nightmare:" "You wake up at night in sweats over it. It's a very humbling experience." Interestingly enough, officers say the dog may not react to a burglar at home ... but once the officer puts on his uniform, the dog goes on duty, too. Recently, officers were able to stay safely in the front of a store while the dog found a burglar in the back bathroom. He then came out, begging, "Don't let him bite me, don't let him bite me!"

Of course, the Class of 2011 continued its tradition of making donations on Program Day. This time, we loaded four shelves with books, toys and stuffed animals, plus \$100 for bus passes and clothing, to help juvenile crime victims. We presented an additional \$250 to public defender Bob Dillinger for Beth's Closet, created in memory of his daughter to reward students at the Pace Center for Girls.

Scott Wheeler '11 summed Criminal Justice Day up best: "That was fun. Where else could you start your day firing a 12-gauge shotgun?"

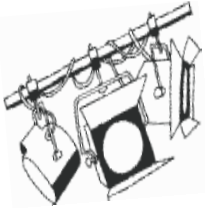

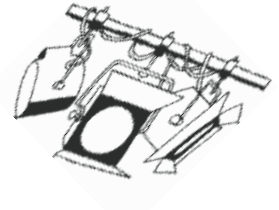

The Clearwater Free Clinic
