Due to the current state of emergency and difficulties our organization is facing, the Leadership Pinellas Board voted to extend the President and current board members' terms for the 2021/2022 year. It seems surreal to think that it was only a year ago that the words "COVID-19," "social distancing," and "unprecedented times" were not a part of our everyday lives. Pre-pandemic, the Board's focus was recruiting more applicants, adding additional programming, and holding a large inaugural event. We were meeting in person. We will meet on the west side of the parking lot near the trail.

Here is another great opportunity to join together with other LP alumni, family, and friends in the outdoors and at a distance! Please consider making plans to join us!

Due to social distance parameters, we are simply providing a location for our event and suggestions for different levels of enjoyment and capabilities for all that choose to participate. As with any LP social event, we have been extra careful to make sure there will be plenty of room for everyone to find their own desired "distance" from others yet still have an opportunity to be social.

There will be bicycle or inline-skate route options for beginner, intermediate, and advanced enthusiasts. Matthew Campbell LP '15 has volunteered his time to orient those that attend on their options for the morning. Riding, skating, or walking distances will range from five miles to 40+ miles.

Suggested routes include:

- 1. Bike ride to Starkey Market and back (40+ miles)
- 2. Bike ride to Brooker Creek Preserve and back (30 miles)
- 3. Bike ride or skate to Anclote River/Tarpon Springs and back (17 miles)
- 4. Bike ride or skate to Wall Springs Park + new extension (10 miles)
- 5. Bike ride, skate, or walk/hike to Honeymoon Island and back (8 miles)
- 6. Bike ride, skate, or walk to Downtown Dunedin and back (8 miles)

The ride Matthew Campbell will be leading will be to Brooker Creek Preserve or Starkey Market, and back, but will be at a more leisurely 10-13 mph pace. Please come prepared with appropriate clothing, water and food as if you were going out on your own. There are restrooms and drinking water at Wall Springs Park, the Dunn Water Reclamation Facility, Brooker Creek, and Starkey Market.
